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




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Surisan Mountain Trails

Surisan Provincial Park



Surrounding the city like a folding screen, Surisan Mountain is beloved as a natural haven by Gunpo's citizens. Its large size and many peaks provide numerous hiking trails for diverse needs.

Banwol Lake Park



Equipped with a loop trail (3.4 km) for walking and open spaces for children to run amidst a beautiful landscape, Banwol Lake Park is a popular destination for locals, especially families.

Royal Azalea Hill



This beloved park, which serves as the venue of the Royal Azalea Festival, turns a bright magenta each spring during the blooming of the park's vast royal azalea field (about 3.5 football pitches in size).

Surisa Temple



Originally founded in the 6th century, this Buddhist temple was recently rebuilt after being destroyed in the Korean War. The path to the temple is well maintained, making it easy to access.


Surisan Arboretum

Brassware Making



The traditional art of Korean brassware (10:3 ratio of copper to tin) making is practiced in Gunpo by Master Kim Mun-ik, who hand-forges various brass goods, such as tableware and musical instruments.

Brassware Training and Education Center



This training and education center aims to preserve and pass down the traditional techniques and artistry of Korean brassware to future generations and provide opportunities to enjoy traditional culture.

Joseon White Porcelain Kiln Site in Sanbon-dong



Two multi-chamber climbing kilns and workshops used to produce white porcelain in the late 15th to early-16th century during the Joseon period can be found at this site in Sanbon-dong.

Tomb and Stele of Jeong Nan-jong



As the resting place of the civil official Jeong Nan-jong (1433-1489), his sons, and their wives, this cemetery shows the traditional layout and stone sculptures of an early Joseon-period cemetery.

Tomb of Yi Gi-jo



Yi Gi-jo (1595-1653) was a high-ranking civil official of the Joseon period. His tomb includes his and his wife's burial mounds, several stone sculptures, and a monument recording his life's achievements.

Tomb of Yi Hang



This is the tomb of the third son of King Sejong, Yi Hang (1480-1504), who was sentenced to death by his half-brother King Yeonsangun due to a conflict between their mothers.

Tomb and Stele of Kim Man-gi



Kim Man-gi (1633-1687) was an esteemed civil official of the Joseon period and the father-in-law of King Sukjong. Near the tomb stands a stele with an inscription composed by the renowned scholar Song Si-yeol.

Head House of the Dongnaegun Branch of the Dongnae Jeong Clan



This representative traditional residence was passed down among the descendants of the civil official Jeong Nan-jong (1433-1489). The large estate's various quarters date as far back as 1783.

Historic House of the Bak Family in Dundae-dong



This traditional-style house was built in 1927 by Bak Yong-deok, a local leader of the rural enlightenment movement. Its features reflect the changing architectural trends of the early 20th century.
